Using our online service means an easier, simpler service for you.

You can:

- * book and cancel appointments
- * order repeat prescriptions
- * View part of your medical records
- *choose a pharmacy of your choice so you can collect your prescriptions without visiting the surgery

The steps below explain how this works.

- * Tell us you would like to start using online services.
- * We will give you a short form to fill in and sign to confirm you agree with the information on the form which you can can download and print.

We confirm the information with you by asking for photo ID, proof of address, a passport or driving licence or a bank or council tax statement. Once ID is confirmed we will then give you a letter with your unique user-

Parking is a pain

Many of our patients including our more elderly and disabled patients are finding it increasingly difficult to find a parking space outside the surgery as there are frequently cars parked there all day.

We would like to see time conditional parking restriction applied and enforced on all day parking outside the surgery. Southend Council have declined the application giving the reason that this is a public highway.

We are asking surgery patients to sign our petition to help persuade the Council to put in place a restriction on parking outside the surgery. This will enable patients, particularly those most impacted by the current lack of any restrictions, including blue badge holders, to park outside the surgery when visiting.

The surgery is committed to providing the best service it can to its patients and your support for this petition is much appreciated.

We could do better

A health profile published by Public Health England shows that we could do a lot better. The report summary says that the health of the people in Southend-on-Sea is varied compared with the England average. About 22% (7,300) of children live in low income families and life expectancy for men is lower than the England average.

- * Health inequalities -Life expectancy is 10.3 years lower for men and 9.5 years lower for women in the most deprived areas of Southend
- *Child health-In Year 6, 16.5% (280) children

- are classified as obese * Adult health - The rate of alcohol-related harm hospital stays is 555, better than the average for England;
- * The rate of smoking related deaths is 334, worse that the average for England while rates of sexually transmitted diseases are better than average.

The report says that priorities for Southend are increasing levels of physical activity, improving health and life chances for children and young people as well as reducing smoking rates
